2.1 Curricular Aspects:	
2.1.1 Curricular Design and Development:	<ul> <li>The College is affiliated to Dibrugarh University and it follows the syllabus, academic calendar and guidelines framed by the university. Some of the faculty members of the college are also involved in revising the course curriculum by offering suggestions in the board meeting convened by the University.</li> <li>At the beginning of each academic session, the curriculum concerning the departments is discussed among the faculty members. The total curriculum is thereafter divided and</li> </ul>
	allotted to the concerned teachers.



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On the basis of the allotted portion of the curriculum, concerned teachers chalk out teaching plans.

 Sessional examinations, group discussions, case study presentations, presentations on course contents are conducted as a part of internal assessment and for the overall development of the students.

#### 2.1.2 Academic Flexibility:

- Teaching plans are drawn out in such a way so that sufficient time for revision can be spared, besides completing the entire volume of the course. For the slow learners and other students desirous of clearing their doubts, provision for remedial and tutorial classes are also made in the class routine.
- The respective teachers specialized in their disciplines; apart from following the syllabus formed by the university, they also engaged in different academic activities like excursion, field-study for practical exposures.
- Teachers play flexible roles to adhere the needs of both the advanced and slow learners without defying the academic calendar of the college which gives benefits to selected students of the college.



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#### 2.1.3 Curriculum Enrichment:

- In order to make curriculum student centric, students have to take part in filed work, project work and excursion etc. for which a specific period is selected as a part of their academic activities. The report of the same is prepared to keep record. The students; with the help of their teachers conduct survey in some select areas about the socio-economic conditions of the locality.
- Seminar presentations for development of presentation and communication skills of the students are also conducted as per scheduled academic calendar. These class room presentations carry marks and the marks are also considered for internal assessment.
- Departments conduct departmental meetings at regular intervals to analyze the progress of the course and discuss about any other important issues relating to the students, department as well as for the college.

 Feedback of the students is collected in each academic session to find out the positive and negative aspects regarding the effectiveness of the curriculum delivery by the

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- teachers as well as of the institution as a whole.

- The course is experiential, learner-centric and industry driven with strong industry





linkage. The students pursuing the course visit various tea gardens of Assam for obtaining firsthand knowledge on tea cultivation, processing and labor management.

- A soil testing laboratory has been developed to analyse different soil chemical and physical parameters.
- Sstudents after successful completion of this course have received employment in Tea Estates across Assam as Assistant Managers of tea plantations or entrepreneurs focusing on profitable and sustainable tea cultivation.

- Laboratories and ICT infrastructure and library services may be suitably upgraded to avoid its obsolescence, and meet the requirements of the stake holders
- Collaborations and interactions with Industry, research organizations, institutions and Universities should be encouraged and supported.
- Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) be fully implemented.
- · Soft skills be introduced in the College.
- Ramps be provided to every building of the College.
- Location of the college is good for demographic inclusion i.e., location has scope for creation of demographic dividend.
- Compliances of the Recommendations of the previous NAAC visit be put on record
- SSR be crosschecked before presenting it to the NAAC Peer Team
- Basics First: The teachers, college/university administrators must reach out to the students.
- Teaching be improved in order to instill in students (the critical bent of mind) the original thinking
- Steps be taken to appreciate the quality of overall education and then social returns in terms of quality graduates capable of addressing social concerns, and responsibilities of society and societal problems. Steps may be:
  - i. Good teaching is the Mantra
  - ii. Strict vigilance/monitoring in teaching-learning process
  - iii. Weekly/monthly assignments by concerned faculty members
  - iv. Fortnightly/Monthly/Bimonthly colloquium be organized to update the

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students with latest/current social/economic/political/banking issues.

- v. Students be trained to:
  - Problem formulation
  - Problem Solving
  - Case Studies
- vi. Stress be given on remedial teaching/doubt clearing sessions, tutorial and extra classes twice/thrice a week
- vii. UG students be rigorously trained/taught
  Grammar,Composition,Translation etc.
- viii. Students be trained/acquainted with writing skills such as precis/letters (business/Advertising/Communication etc.), Assignments writing, Statement of purpose etc.
- ix. Students should be trained in Spoken and Communicative English
- Faculty members of English and Assamese be given space (incentives/time etc.)to get engaged in assignments
- College Academics should go hand in hand with the University and the UGC guideline and reforms
- UG students be given space/opportunities or they may be trained how to formulate problems and solve problems
- Instill/nurture in students the Exercise Solving Habit especially in Mathematics and Science
- Academic Audit is encouraging to the overall good of the college. Exercise of this sort will stimulate/fillip the quality journey of education of the college
- Adopt right mix of Chalk and Talk /Lecture and ICT applications in the teachinglearning process
- Solutions to quality education solely lies in how the teachers deliver so, we should reach out to students.
- Efforts may be directed for recruitment and retention of quality faculty with appropriate cadre ratio.
- Efforts can be made to acquire full autonomy from the University
