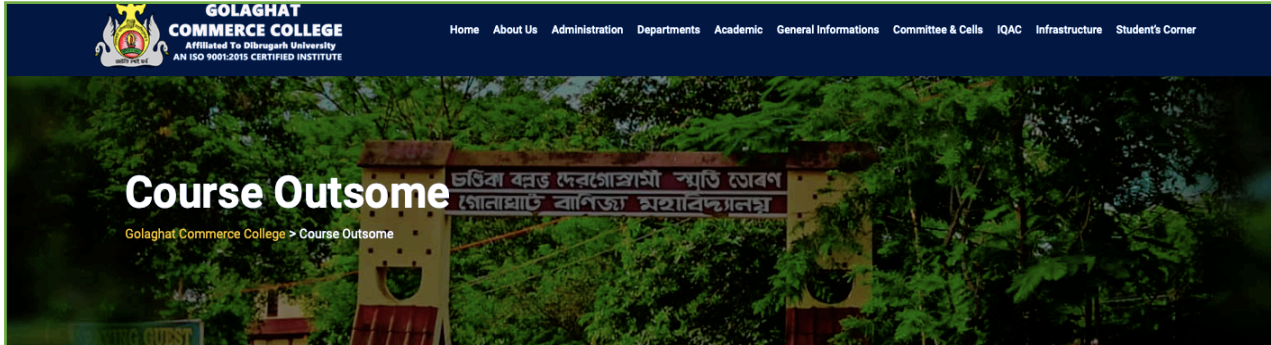

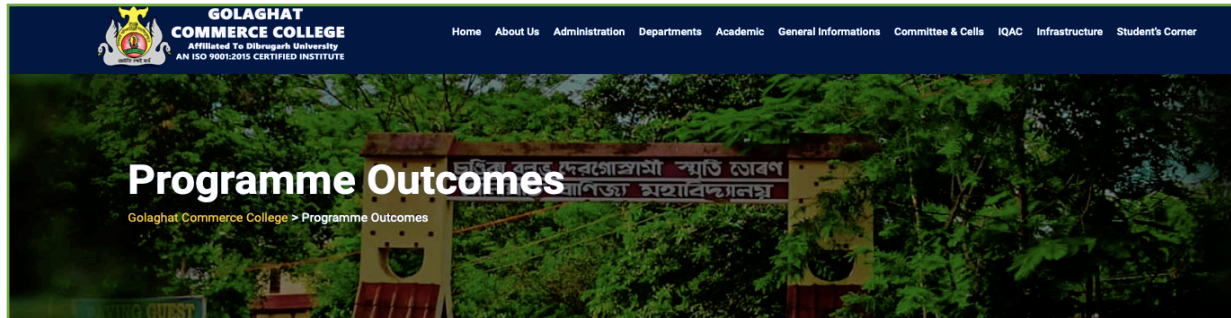

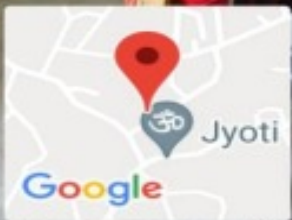

Students can appear in exams like National Eligibility Test (NET), State Level Eligibility Test (SLET) etc. Immediately after completing the program and after clearing the NET/SLET, students become eligible for teaching in higher education institutions. Students will have choices to pursue PhD after completing the course.

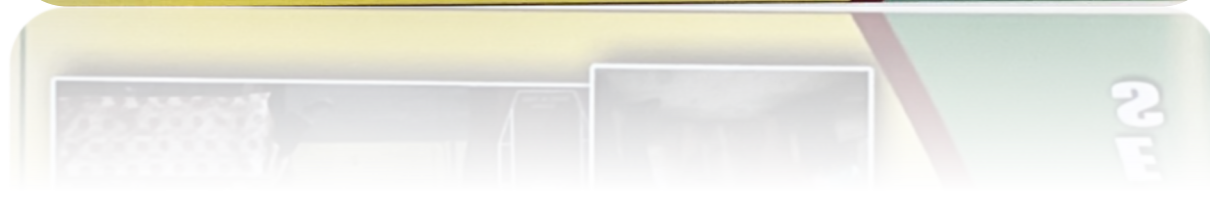
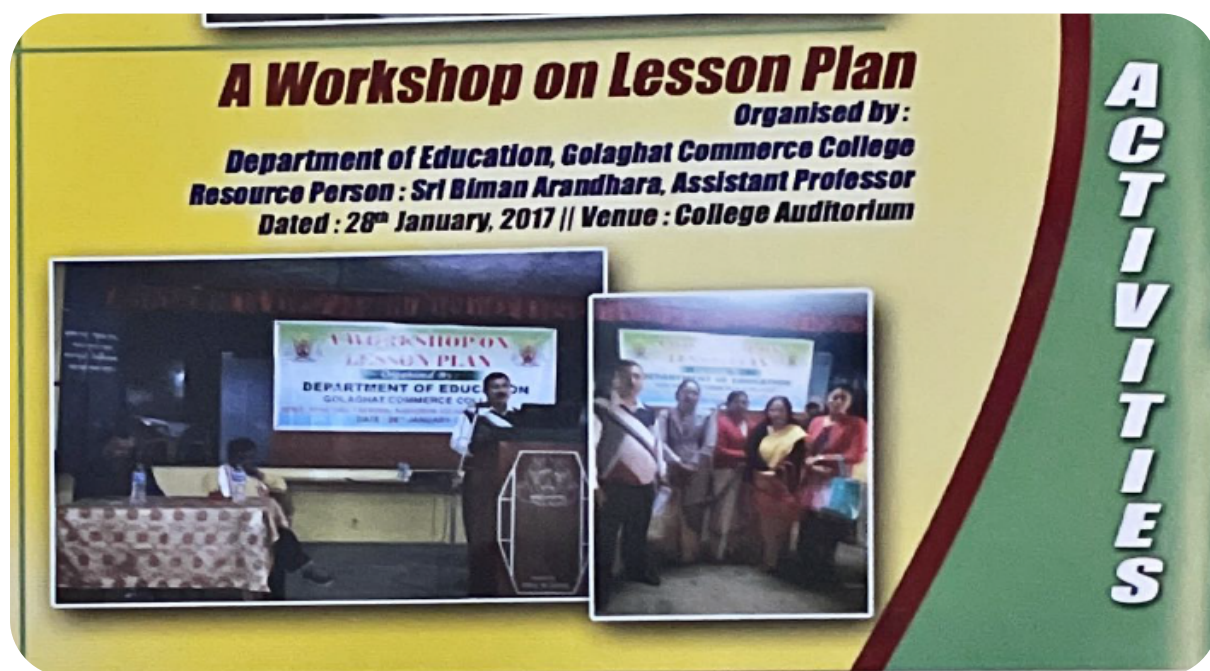

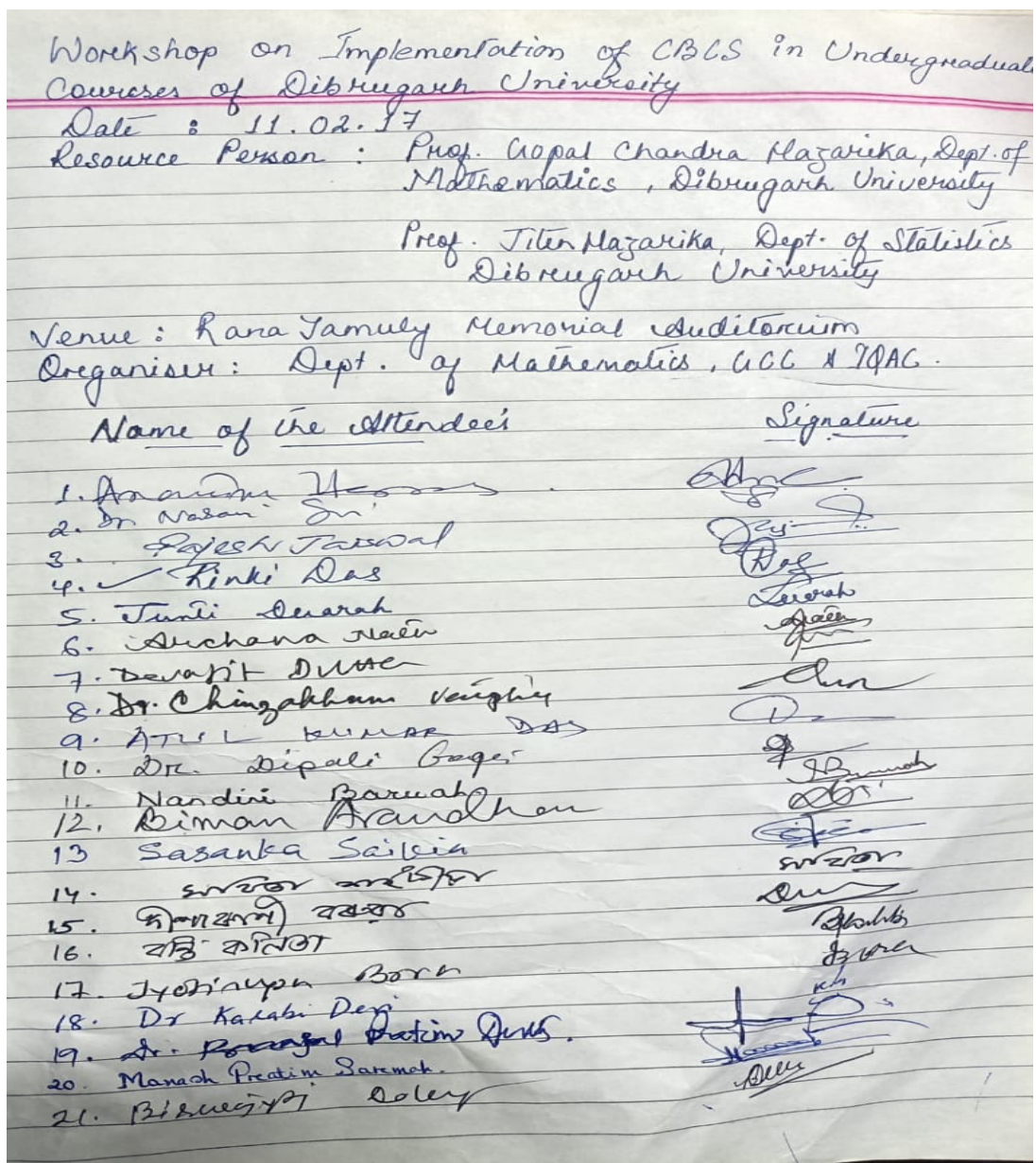

- Students were also asked to share their experiences in the classrooms. They were asked if they are facing any experiential problem.

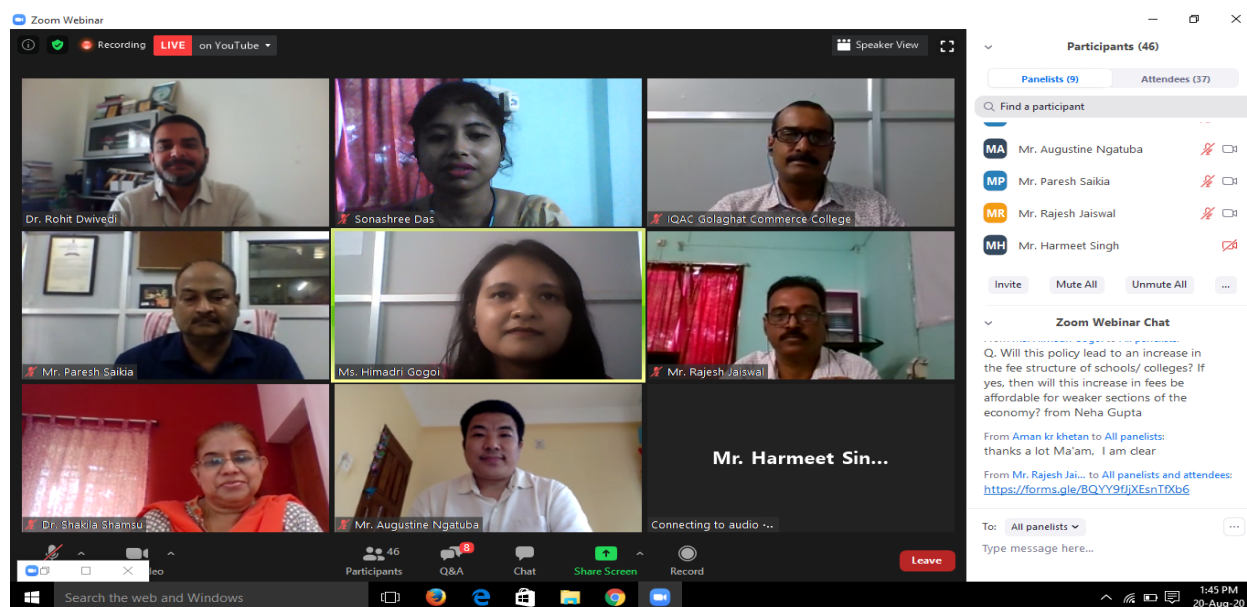
