





About the Seminar

The North Eastern Region (NER) refers to the easternmost region of India comprising of eight states and it shares borders with five South Asian countries Nepal, Bhutan, China, Myanmar and Bangladesh. The region accounts for 7.9 percent of the country's land space and is the territory of around 3.8 percent of India's population. The North-East Region is one of the back-ward regions of India characterized by low per-capita Income, low capital formation, in-adequate infrastructure facilities,

geographical isolation and communication bottleneck geographical isolation and communication bottleneck, inadequate exploitation of natural resources like mineral resources, hydro power potential, forests etc. Apart from these, there are inter-state differences with respect to their resource endowments, level of industrialization as well as infrastructural

clities.

After independence, the Government of India (GOI) has After independent of the presidently tried in developing sustainable livelihood and integrating approaches to tackle poverty in India. In addition, employment generation to eradicate poverty was accepted as a goal of development planning. Since 1960s, series of measures were taken such as nationalization of banks, expansion of rural were taken such as nationalization of banks, expansion of rural branch networks, mandatory system of priority sector lending, extension of subsidized credit, establishment of regional rural banks (RRBs) and the Integrated Rural Development Program (IRDP). These initiatives have increased rural outreach and credit volume to some extent. However, higher operational credit volume to some extern. However, nigner operational costs as well as unsuitable and unprofitable institutional structure conceived these programmes as supply led and not demand driven. In addition, the lack of entreprene absence of backward and forward linkages led to the failure of government initiatives. Huge non-performing assets (NPAs) weakened the strength of financial institutions and further reduced their interest in rural areas. The era also witnessed the establishment of apex institutions such as National Bank for Agricultural and Rural Development (NABARD) and the Small Scale Industries Development Board of India (SIDBI) and many civil societies, which were extending credit to poor.

In order to encourage entrepreneurship, GOI has come up with various initiatives such as the National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM), National Urban Livelihood Mission and National Rural employment guarantee scheme to reaution ac-poor families and link them to sustainable livelihood opportunities. Skill India - a multi-skill development programme has been launched in 2014 with a mission for job creation and has been launched in 2014 with a mission for job creation and entrepreneurship for all socio-economic classes, it strives to establish an international equivalent of the Indian framework on skill development, creating workforce mobility and enhancing youth employability. The college is running a post-graduate diploma course in Tea Plantation and Management in collaboration with North Eastern Tea Association (NETA) and this experience has put the college in an advantageous position in comparison to other Higher Educational Institutions in the district to organize an International Seminar on a topic of such practicability associated with the stakeholders of the tea industry in Assam. Teaching staff of the Institution were encouraged to attend the seminar and 32 teachers from the college attended the seminar. Issues like the colonial legacy of tea still haunting tea industry, the emergence of small tea growers in variegated geo-economic and socio-cultural conditions, and the problems faced by STGs in contradistinction to the ones encountered by the larger tea estates etc. were discussed in the seminar. In the course of the discussion, it was pointed out that while the blenders and marketing channels appropriate ever-increasing profits, the small farmers have to bear the burden of fluctuating and falling commodity prices. In his profile, the small-holder tea grower is devoid of knowledge, starved of resources and lacking in organization particularly in respect of doing effective marketing. It emerged from the discussion that while farmers need some help in production, they need more help in manufacturing and most help in marketing

The Dept. of Mathematics in collaboration with the IQAC organized a National Webinar on "The Story and History of Pi (π), a Mathematical Constant "on 27th August 2020. Mr. Paresh Saikia, Principal in his inaugural address highlighted the features of Pi that it is an irrational number pi cannot be expressed as a common fractional though fraction such as 22/7 are commonly used to approximate and its decimal representation never ends and never settles into a permanently repeating pattern because of its most elementary definition relates to the circle pi is found in many formulae in trigonometry and geometry especially those concerning circles elapses and spheres several books devoted to pi have been published. The record-setting calculations of the digits of pi often results in news headlines and to know more about such a widely used unique number department of mathematics and statistics Golaghat commerce college is organizing this national webinar inviting a prominent resource person.

The Resource Person **Dr. Nayandeep Deka Baruah**, **Professor**, **Tezpur University** in his talk spoke about Pi that from our school days we know that 22over 7 is a is an approximation of the value of pi but pi is irrational and 22 over 7. He said that there is a very interesting history behind PI that started for a long time over four thousand years that means over four millennia this constant has been studied so therefore it is also known as the constant of the **king of constants** that means that it is this is recognizable by everybody and it appears in almost every branches of science physics in chemistry everywhere in engineering and it is recognizable by the common people.

He also added that the study of pi has been started for over 4 thousand years but there are only five or six actual methods of calculating the value of pi there are many other formulas but mainly four methods are there and many of the great mathematicians of ancient time were involved in the study of pi for example long back the Greeks then Archimedes, Euler, Gauss then Ramanujan and many more were involved in the study of phi and this is the only constant that has been studied quite extensively till today.







CONCEPT NOTE

Pi (π) , the 16th letter of the Greek alphabet, is used to represent the most widely known mathematical constant, which is the ratio of the circumference of a circle to its diameter. No matter how large or small a circle is, pi will always work out to be the same number. Because it's most elementary definition relates to the circle. Pi is found in many formulae in trigonometry and geometry, especially those concerning circles, ellipses, and spheres.

Pi occurs in various mathematical problems involving the lengths of arcs or other curves, the areas of ellipses, sectors, and other curved surfaces, and the volumes of many solids. It is also used in various formulae of physics and engineering to describe periodic phenomena such as the motion of pendulums, the vibration of strings, alternating electric currents. The ubiquity of Pi makes it one of the most widely known mathematical constants both inside and outside the scientific community.


About the FDP:
